Summary

The Government of Somaliland annually implements a number of projects, including development projects, procurement of equipment, and purchase of vehicles. The purpose of these projects are normally to ensure economic growth or to meet social development goals. To enhance efficiency and meet specific objectives it was necessary to have a project booklet which is a combination of the different spending's of the projects, with the aim of effective management of spending and ensure that work under a contract is on time, within budget, and to the government's specifications.

The budget allocated for long –term asset is 160,957,089,070 SLSh, which is 6% of the total budget. Long –term property refers to buildings, vehicles, machinery, boats and other long-term assets. Also, the budget allocated other government projects is 199,641,111,508 SLSh , which is 8% of the total budget, which is more than 9% the previous budget 2020 which is equivalent to 16,860,752,624 SLSh. though there is increase in the budget, the projects have not changed, and increase is in line with the overall budget increase, with new water expansion in Hargeisa, Burao and Ergavo, as well as a new fisheries development project.

The 2022 Budget (excluding donor funds and local government budgets) stands at 2.4 trillion SLSh, with 15% or 360.6 billion SLSh of it allocated to the government's development and capital spending priorities. As shown in figure 1, about 79% of this amount or 282.9 billion SLSh is allocated to the development projects. The remaining amount is allocated to the procurement of vehicles (3%) and equipment (18%).

As shown in the table1 below the budget allocated for the projects is 360,598,200,578 SLSh, with 79% or 282 billion SLSh of it allocated to the development projects, the remaining amount is allocated to procurement of equipment (18%) and the purchase of vehicle (3%). Table 2 shows sectorial classification of budget in terms of percentage share of the projects.

Figure 1: Breakdown of the 2022 Budget for project of total

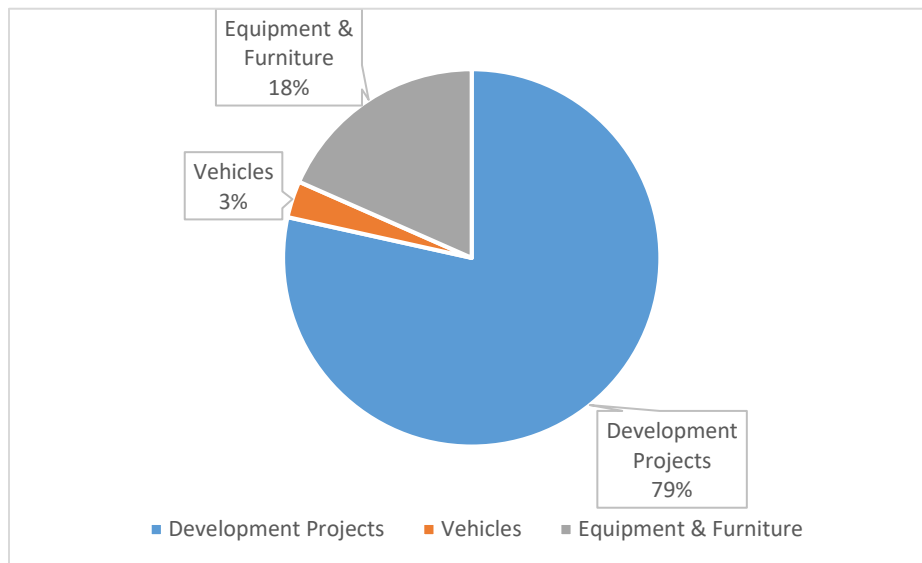
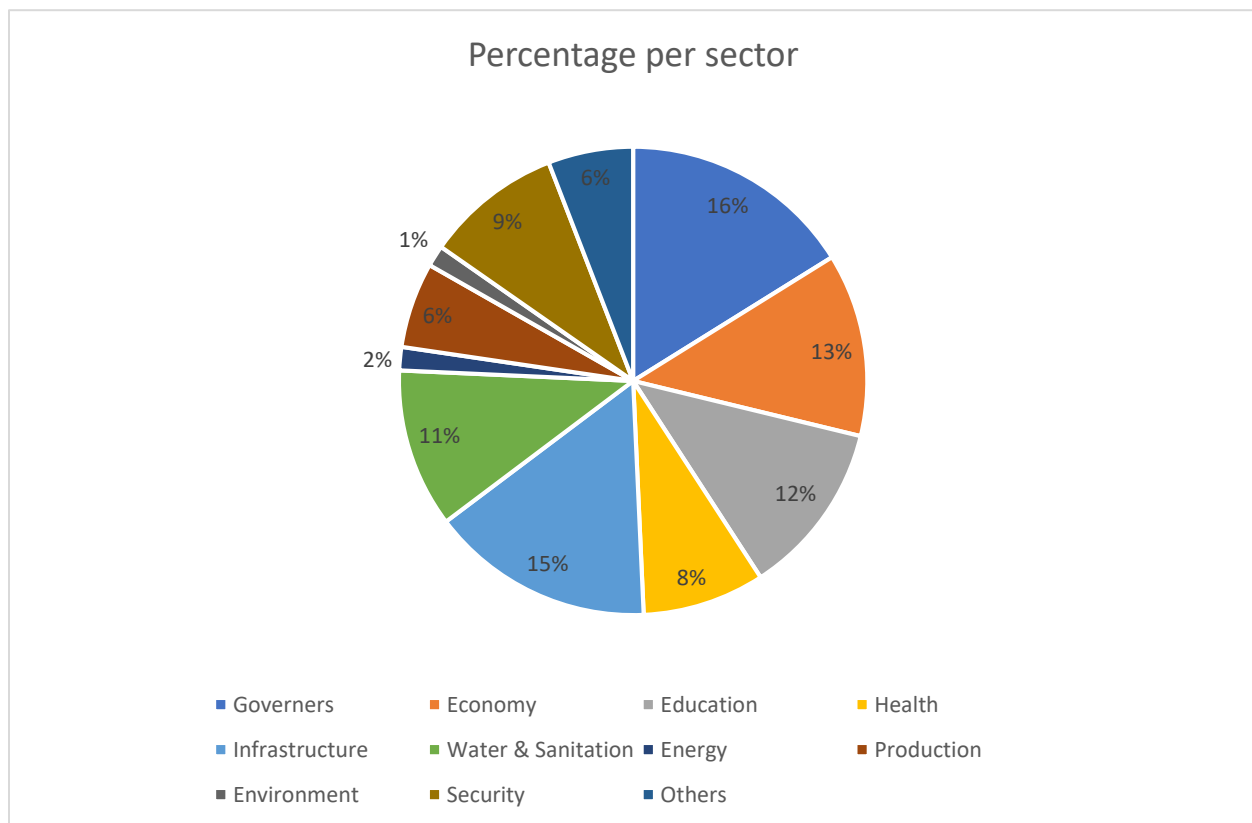
