Ministry of Finance Development

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Summary

The Government of Somaliland, through the 2021 Budget, will continue to address the country's most pressing development needs in order to catalyze growth while adhering to the National Development Plan II and the 2030 Vision. The purpose of this project handbook is to clearly layout the major government spending pertaining to development projects, expenditure on vehicles and Office equipment (i.e. in particular spending that will require requisition submissions to the Tender Board). The document is intended to ensure efficient and effective management of public resources and adherence to budget plans.

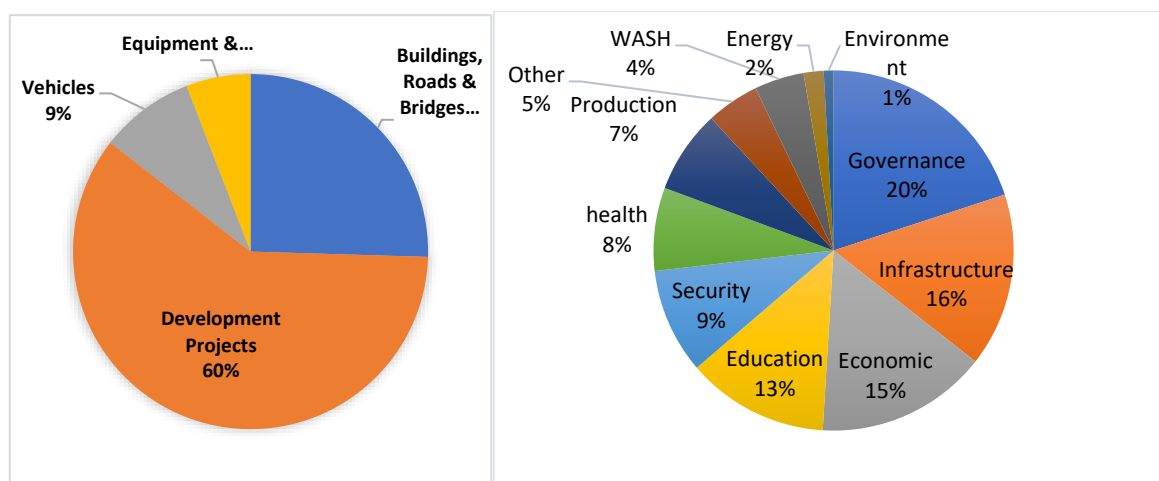
The 2021 Budget (excluding donor funds and local government budgets) stands at 2.101 trillion SLSh, with 13% or 272.7 billion SLSh of it allocated to the government's development and capital spending priorities. As shown in figure 1, about 60% of this amount or 163.7 billion SLSh is allocated to the development projects (excluding construction of buildings and roads). The remaining amount is allocated to the constructions of Roads, Buildings & Bridges (25%), the procurement of vehicles (9%) and equipment (6%).

At the sector level as shown in figure 1(right), the Governance, Infrastructure, Economic and Education sectors have received 64% of the 272.7 billion SLSh budget allocated for development projects and Capital spending.

Description

The government of Somaliland has budgeted 400 million SLSh for the construction of additional office buildings at the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Tourism.

Objective

This investment aims to further strengthen the MoTIT's capacity to provide services to Somaliland's businesses and enterprises. With the one-stop-shop housed at the MoTIT, the need to reduce congestion is necessary to ensure that the objective of the one-stop-shop is achieved (i.e. reducing the cost of set-up a business). The main objectives of this investment are:

1. Reduce congestion at the MoTIT
2. Increase employee productivity and service delivery
3. Reduce costs of setting up a business (e.g. faster registrations, etc.)

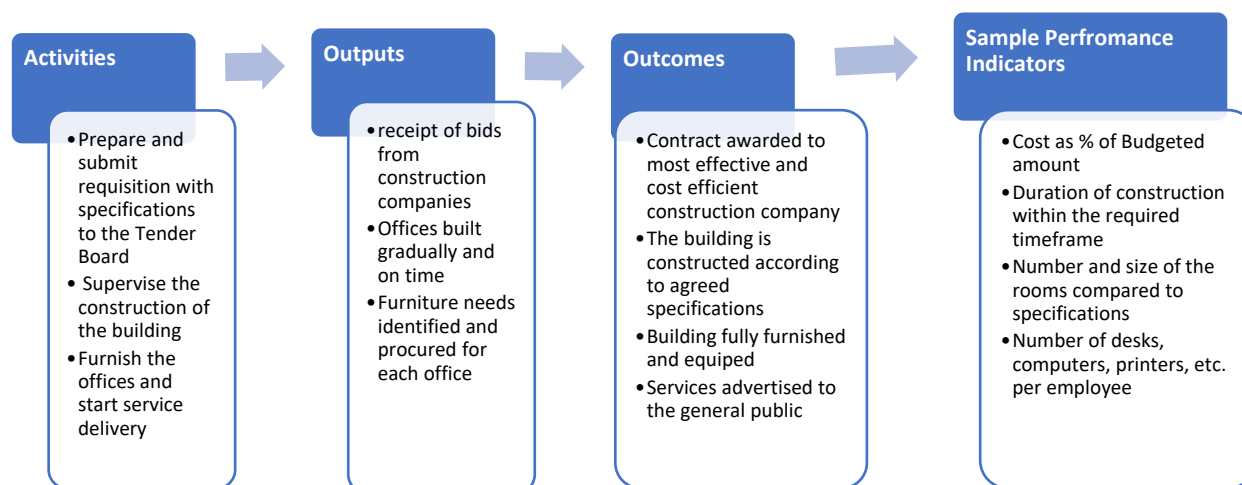

Survey samples will be collected using short questionnaires for each household in selected enrollment areas (EAs) across the country.

Objective

The aim of this project is to build the ministry's knowledge base on Somaliland's agricultural sector in order to be able to efficiently and effectively address identified challenges and issues. In particular, the project will help provide information on:

1. The products cultivated and the number of farmers in each region
2. The number of commercial and non-commercial farms
3. Identify and subsequently address the challenges faced by farmers
4. Create jobs

3. increase fishery output.

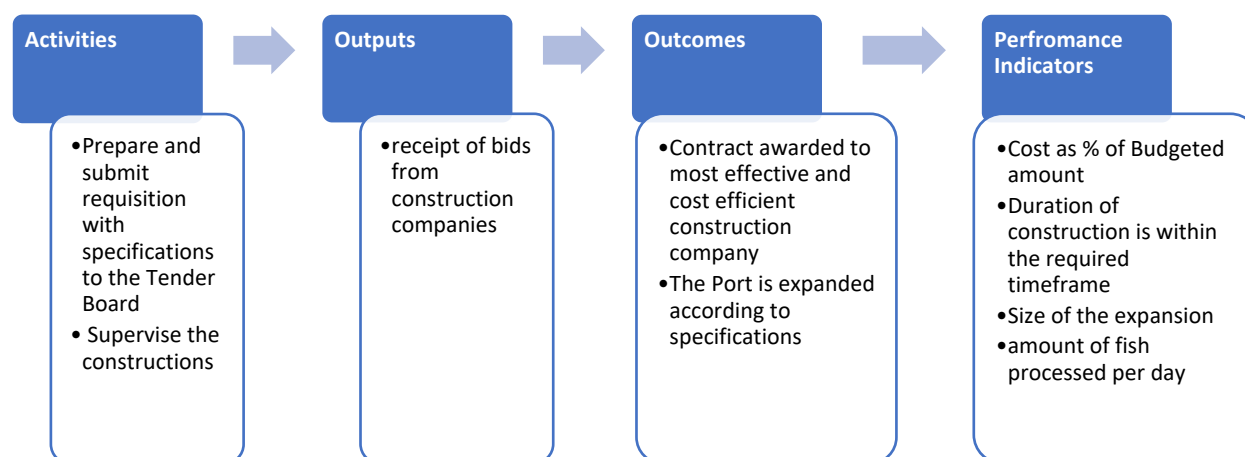

3. Help protect the environment through the retention of hazardous materials and detrimental sedimentation
4. Help alleviate poverty

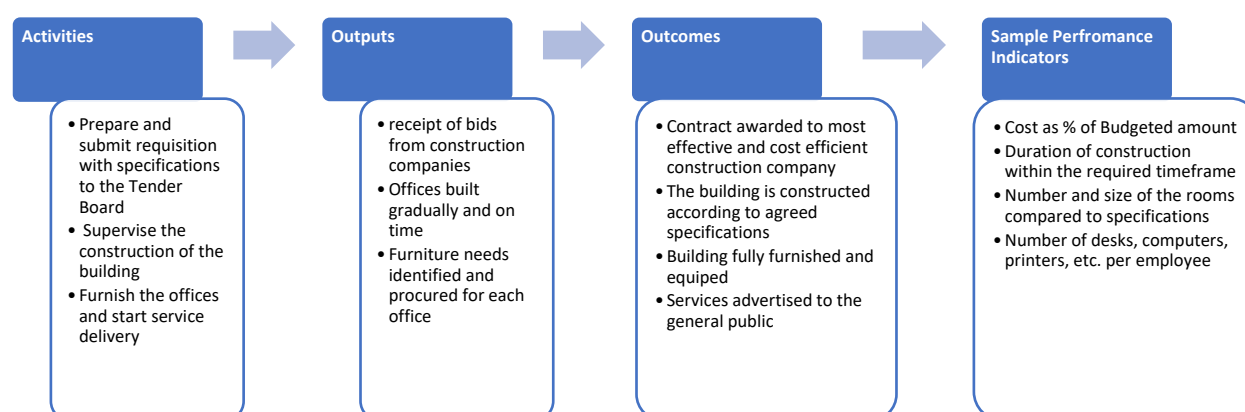

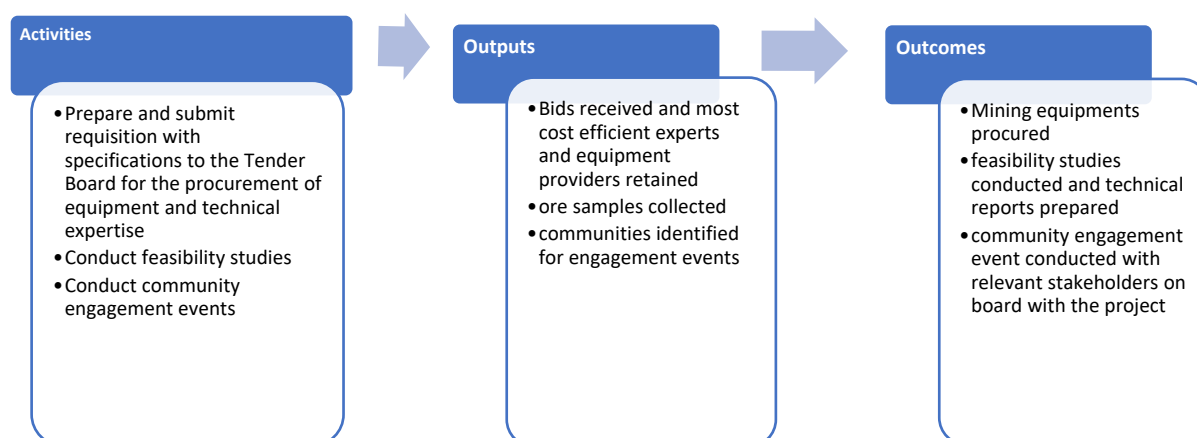
